

5 FISHING KNOTS

Every Angler Should Know



• THINGS TO REMEMBER •

1

Always wet the line
This creates less friction and it will allow you to make the knot tighter

2

Trim the end of the knot
Always trim any excess line to avoid snags or tangled lines

3

Don't rush
Take your time and do it properly to avoid mistakes

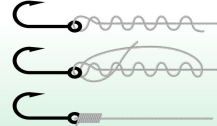
IMPROVED CLINCH KNOT

WHAT IT'S USED FOR

The improved clinch knot is used to tie line to a hook or a lure

INSTRUCTIONS ON HOW TO TIE IT

- 1 Thread the tag end of the line through the hook eye, then wrap it around the standing line 5 times
- 2 Take the tag end of the line and put it through the loop in front of the hook eye, then run the line through the second loop that was just created
- 3 Hold the hook and pull on the standing line to tighten the knot



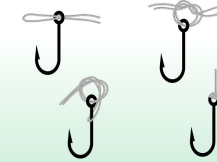
PALOMAR KNOT

WHAT IT'S USED FOR

The palomar knot is used to tie line to a hook or a lure

INSTRUCTIONS ON HOW TO TIE IT

- 1 Take the end of the line and double it over to create a loop, then take the loop and thread it through the hook eye
- 2 Take the loop and do a loose overhand knot
- 3 Take the hook and pull it through the loop, then pull on the standing line to tighten the knot



TURLE KNOT

WHAT IT'S USED FOR

The turtle knot is used for tying line to hooks and lures (good for thin lines and small hooks)

INSTRUCTIONS ON HOW TO TIE IT

- 1 Thread the tag end of the line through the hook eye, then create a big loop by using a loose double overhand knot
- 2 Pass the hook through the loop you just created, then start pulling on the standing line to tighten the knot



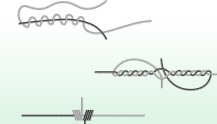
BLOOD KNOT

WHAT IT'S USED FOR

The blood knot is used to tie two lines together. It is best to use this knot for lines of similar diameters

INSTRUCTIONS ON HOW TO TIE IT

- 1 Overlap the end of the two lines, then wrap the first line over the second 5 times
- 2 Wrap the second line over the first 5 times, then bring both tag ends in the middle between the two lines
- 3 Slowly pull the standing lines in opposite directions until the knot is tight



SNELL KNOT

WHAT IT'S USED FOR

The snell knot is used to tie line to a hook

INSTRUCTIONS ON HOW TO TIE IT

- 1 Pass the line through the hook eye, then fold it down on itself so you create a loop near the bottom of the hook
- 2 Hold the loop, then take the tag end and wrap it around the shank 5 to 10 times, then feed the tag end through the loop
- 3 Pull the standing line and tag end to tighten the knot
